3. Agricultural Awareness Programme – Organic Farming Techniques:

Agricultural Awareness to promote food security, end poverty and hunger in 5 villages. The small and marginal farmers are formed into clubs to work collectively to find solutions to their many agrarian problems and issues. They are initiated to take up credit and savings. Training on improved farming techniques, cropping patterns and practices, watershed conservation, protection, rational management and sustainable development and utilization of water; land leveling to retain the rich alluvial top soil ; reclamation of waste land, dry land agriculture, land use patterns; the use of drought-resistant crops; soil and water conservation methods; pest management, use of fertilizers and pesticides, hybrid seeds, modern agricultural methods, farm implements and management techniques and practices will help the farmers to improve their skill sets.

4. Medical Camps:

Four medical camps were conducted in which the women were educated on preventive, curative and promotives aspects of health. Much emphasis was laid on health hygiene and sanitation, water borne diseases and seasonal diseases malarial infections that are very common today. Charts were used to help the women understand during the medical camps.

5. Awareness programme on Swatcha Bharat:

Basing on the Government India's programme – SWCHA BHARAT men, women and children were enlightened on health hygiene and sanitation. They were advised to end open defecation through the use of toilets, environmental sanitation, cleaning of surroundings not to litter waste but to burn them so that the environment is not polluted. The participants are also enlightened on the various schemes of the Government to access recourses and improve their livelihood.
