Specific Target Group

The western part of Guntur district is very neglected by both the Government as well as the Non Governmental Organizations. The poverty of the people is very high, many farmers committed suicides and left their children orphan and their wives widows. In the 10 villages of Rentachintala Mandal alone there are 630 widows as per the findings of our survey. The life situation of the widows is far worse in the other 14 Mandals. In the 10 villages of Rentachintala Mandal alone there are 210 orphans and 49 semi-orphans as per the findings of our survey. The life situation of the children is far worse in the other 14 Mandals.

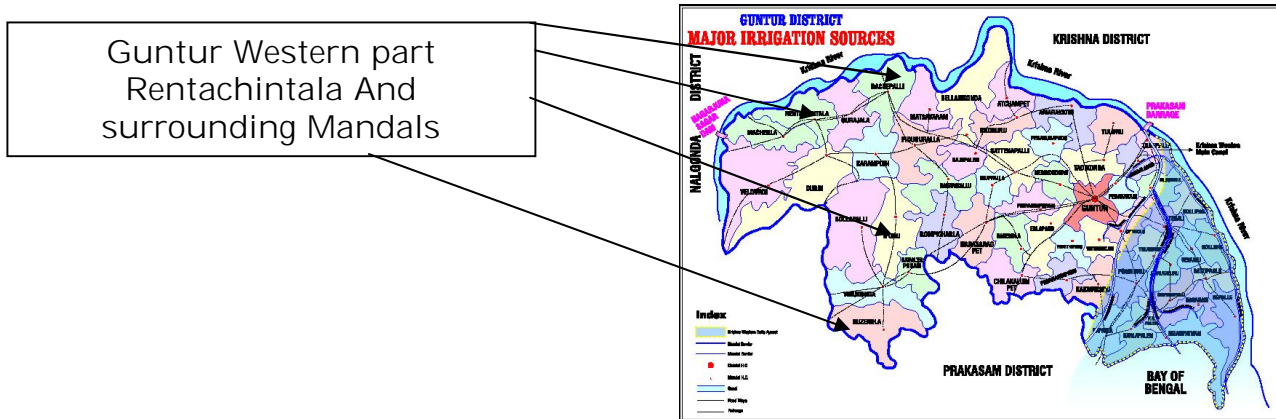
26 debt-ridden farmers of Guntur district had sold their kidneys. Many of the cases were reported from the **Rentachintala** in Guntur district, where peasants grew cotton and chillies.

Health, hygiene and sanitation levels are very poor in the target villages. The people defecate in the open causing an enormous health hazard. Human excreta contain harmful germs which are transmitted into the sources of food, air and water. As a result children suffer from water-borne and water-related diseases. These communities being illiterate are ignorant of health care, nutrition, and sanitation. They are not interested in the same due to poverty. The people suffer from many diseases. Morbidity and mortality rates are high. The women have no knowledge of immunization, ante-natal and post natal care, reproductive health care, family welfare, environment sanitation, etc., Infant and maternal mortality rate among these socially marginalized communities are high. Poor environmental sanitation and water stagnation breed mosquitoes causing malarial diseases.

In the past due to unsafe use of syringes there is Hepatitis c is prevailing in this area and due to unsafe use of polio drops many children in the past were affected with Polio. In the 10 villages of Rentachintala Mandal alone there are 150 polio affected people as per the findings of our survey. The life situation of these people is far worse in the other 14 Mandals.

In the above circumstances, we decided to work on the western part of Guntur district and started our work in a small way from the past two years. In view of this we have started "DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY FOR POOR" at Rentachintala and got the permissions from the Government.

These people in these Mandals are very backward, poor and illiterate. These villages are on the River bank of Krishna and they are surrounded by a thick forest called Nallamala Forest.
